

ArtsHub Update

Highlights

- The Theater Communications Group (TCG) held a four-day virtual theatre conference this week. A number of ART staff members attended, along with many members of the Portland theatre community and hundreds of theatre leaders from around the U.S. In an expression of solidarity with Black colleagues who are enduring the pain of continued acts of racism, violence, and injustice, the focus of the programing was changed to how theatre makers can stand in solidarity with the Black, Indigenous and People of Color (BIPOC) communities and do the overdue work needed to dismantle the systems of racism that are built into all of our institutions, including arts organizations. We want to be clear that this includes ART.
- With a portion of the PPP funding, ART has engaged over 30 artists (writers, sound designers, actors, production support, and teaching artists) to develop a number of projects in June that can be shared with audiences in the future. More details on this work will be coming at a later update.
- Resident Artists Josie Seid and E.M. Lewis have been commissioned by Portland Center Stage to create short plays as part of the *Play at Home* project. The *Play at Home* scripts are designed to be read - and performed - by the public from their homes. The plays are ten minutes or shorter and will be available for free at playathome.org.
- Resident Artist Andrea Stolowitz and Jonathan Walters of Hand2Mouth (H2M) have been invited to work with the NYC-based Orchard Project's Liveness Lab to further develop their project, *This Town.* ART and H2M are collaborating to secure grant funding for ongoing work developing the piece.
- Portland Actors Conservatory (PAC) first year students are preparing to audition to advance to the second year class. Adjudicators include theatre professionals from PAC, ART and Portland Center Stage.
- ART Education is offering thirteen new virtual summer classes, including: The Comedic Monologue with Sarah Lucht; Embracing Uncertainty with Michael Mendelson; Director's Prep with Adriana Baer; Improvisation for Actors with Theresa Robbins Dudeck; Movement Workshop and Physical Dramaturgy with Adin Walker; (Play)Writing Thru the Quarantine with Dan Kitrosser; Exploring Place In Your Play with E.M. Lewis; Authoring Queer Futures with Adin Walker; Alexander Technique with Jacklyn Maddux; Improviation for Collaborating, Creating & Connecting with Theresa Robbins Dudeck; Stay Stage Ready with Sarah Lucht; and Dramaturgy for the Audience with Barbie Wu.
