Highlights

- The inaugural issue of ART Quarterly Magazine is live for ART Subscriber Members. It can be viewed here: <u>Issuu</u>. Congratulations and many thanks to Leslie Crandell Dawes for proposing the idea of creating the magazine and for serving as Editor. It will be available to the general public next week. A publication of Artists Repertory Theatre, it features articles from Artistic Director Dámaso Rodríguez, Resident Artist Vin Shambry, guest artist Kristen Mun, and a featured article by playwright Anthony Hudson (which also appears in American Theatre Magazine). The ART Quarterly is an ad-free publication with the mission to build and support the vibrant arts community, in its multitude of forms, and delve into its interconnectivity with the performing arts.
- ART Mercury Company 2.0 launched this week with pre-production work for the short film See Me and
 rehearsals for The Vertical City, an audio project by Diana Burbano being developed collaboratively with
 students of The Actors Conservatory (TAC). Over the next six weeks, an eclectic mix of new audio and
 video projects will receive support, along with fourteen workshops and readings of new plays. Over ninety
 playwrights, actors, directors, filmmakers, producers, and designers will bring their creative energies to a
 total of twenty-two projects during Mercury Company 2.0.
- ART has secured three years of funding to establish a full-time position of Artistic Director Fellow. This two-year fellowship (with the option to renew for a third year) is intended to prepare the recipient to lead an arts organization of comparable size to ART. The Artistic Director Fellow will serve as a member of the artistic team and will direct at least one ART mainstage production each season during the time of their fellowship. They will also be encouraged to work as a freelance artist, locally and nationally. This new position will serve as the Director of the DNA: Oxygen program, a newly established initiative at ART with funding restricted to the development and production of new work generated by, led by, and featuring Black, Indeginous, and People of Color (BIPOC) artists. The following seven member Search Committee will interview candidates and oversee the process: Artistic Director Dámaso Rodríguez, Development & Marketing Director Kisha Jarrett, ART Board Vice-Chair Pancho Savery, ART Board Member Justin



Peters, Director of New Works Luan Schooler, ART Resident Artist Josh Weinstein, ART Resident Artist Susannah Mars, and DNA: Oxygen member Kristen Mun. Visit ART's website for the <u>full job description</u> and to apply.
